General Safety Rules for Robotic

1- Students must not use any tool, machine or other piece of equipment until they have been formally instructed in it's safe and proper operation by Mr.Yablon Mr.Tiu or other qualified adult. IF AT ANY TIME YOU DO NOT FEEL THAT YOU CAN USE A TOOL OR MACHINE SAFELY, ASK FOR THE INSTRUCTOR'S HELP BEFORE PROCEEDING.

2- Proper and safe clothing will be worn when any machinery is to be operated. Long hair must be tightly secured. Loose sleeves and other hazardous garments must be made safe with ties or rubber bands.

3- APPROPRIATE PROTECTIVE DEVICES MUST BE USED DURING WORK PERIODS. Safety glasses are mandatory. Ear protection must be used when loud noise may be present. Dust masks must be used when there is sawdust or other potentially harmful particulate matter in the air.

4- REPORT ANY UNSAFE CONDITION TO THE INSTRUCTOR IMMEDIATELY. Do not use any tool or machine that is damaged.

5- Students must be aware of the location and the proper use of the safety shut off switches in the lab.

6- RUNNING IS NOT PERMITTED IN THE LAB.

7- PUSHING OTHERS IS NOT PERMITTED IN THE LAB.

8- THROWING ANYTHING IN THE LAB IS FORBIDDEN.

9- STUDENTS MUST REPORT ANY AND ALL INJURIES TO THE INSTRUCTOR IMMEDIATELY.

10- Do not crowd or distract (talk to) anyone working with any tool or machine.

11- You must not endanger the safety of others while using any tool or machine. Be aware of others close by that may be injured as a result of flying chips or other dangerous items.

12- THE MOST IMPORTANT PIECE OF SAFETY EQUIPMENT IN THE LAB IS YOUR BRAIN! THINK CAREFULLY FIRST, THEN ACT.
